### Maundy Thursday, April 1 at 7pm

- ♦ Foot washing at 7pm—during the service you are invited to have a foot washing with your own family members or even wash your hands during this part of the service. You can have a bowl of water and a towel nearby. During this part of the service, you may also sit in prayer during this time. This service ends in silence
- ♦ <u>Delayed communion</u>—Eucharist will be celebrated on Maundy Thursday but distribution of communion will be delayed until Good Friday morning at 9am.

#### Good Friday, April 2

- ♦ <u>9am Communion distribution</u> (from Maundy Thursday) outside the main doors of church—masks and social distancing apply.
- ♦ <u>12noon Good Friday liturgy</u>—You are invited to attend online via zoom. This service ends in silence.
- ♦ <u>Stations of the Cross</u> will be available online for you to experience on your own time throughout the day today.

#### Easter Sunday, April 4 at 9:30am (Communion Distribution at 11am)

- ♦ <u>Communion distribution</u> at 11am—Since we will not be meeting in-person for the service we will celebrating Eucharist online (via zoom). Communion distribution will follow the service at 11am outside the church by parking lot doors.
- Social gathering at 11am or after communion distribution—bring your own lawn chair, sit and chat for a while. There will be no formal activities during this time. It's just an opportunity to celebrate being together. Social distancing and masks apply; we look forward to seeing you across the parking lot soon!

Note: Communion Distribution is not a liturgical service, this is only the dispensing of communion wafers.


## Men's Bible Study Wednesdays, April 7 & 21, 8:00am on Zoom

# Food For Thought



In honor of Earth Day this month's Food For Thought has been contributed by the CTK Climate Care Team.

## Help Us Protect the Earth from Plastic Water Bottles by Mike Paugh, Member of the CTK Climate Care Team

The Climate Care Team has been active in looking at ways our community can work together to be better stewards of the Earth and the natural resources we are so blessed to enjoy. As we approach Earth Day on April 22<sup>nd</sup>, I wanted to share my story of becoming conscious of the damage that plastic water bottles are causing to our environment.

I don't remember exactly how long I have been using it. I do know that I have been in my current job for almost seven and a half years and I remember using it when I worked at my previous job for about seven or eight years before I left there. I fill it two to three times a day and carry it around with me most of the time.

I am talking about my refillable water bottle.

At one time I had a small refrigerator in my office and I took cases of bottled water to work with me. I went through four to five of those bottles a day. In a five-day work week that is somewhere around 20 to 25 pieces of single use plastic that went to a landfill or a recycle bin. That adds up over time.

Did you know that it takes about a quarter of a water bottle's volume in petroleum to make the plastic bottle? That means that each 16-ounce bottle uses about 4 ounces of petroleum to produce it. That is about 17 million barrels of oil worldwide.

Also, only around 23% of these bottles get recycled. The rest end up in landfills or our oceans.

Consider getting a reusable bottle and using it. A good one costs around twelve bucks. A case of water, if you catch it on sale, is around four bucks. Three cases of water and you have paid for your cool new bottle and saved 72 bottles from being produced and disposed of.




## Time to Plant Pinwheels Open Offering for April

## **Vestry Update**

The Financial Report this month confirmed that the mortgage on the church was paid off by virtue of gift by an anonymous donor. This gives us the ability to better fund the projects we've been planning. We still have to consider the diocese restrictions on people in the building and prepare the building for re entry, but we can definitely plan the projects soon. We will look at the replacement of the carpet in Kempsell Hall and the repairs to the office area. We may also be able to look at a potential Columbarium.

The Climate Care group is potentially planning a project for the grounds on the south side of the church building near the sidewalk. They will present it to the Vestry for approval for work this spring

We will have Murphy Mechanical evaluate the HVAC system. Our goal is to make sure there is proper ventilation and circulation in the church building to make a safe return to worshiping in the building. We continue to develop plans for regathering in the parking lot or in the building. As soon as it is possible, we want to gather together.

We are still looking at cameras and other equipment to better facilitate our Zoom worship services from the nave and live-stream services even once we can return to the building. We began live-streaming worship on Palm Sunday and will continue this over the next few weeks.

The Vestry has appointed a Search Committee to begin the work of finding a new rector for Christ the King. The members of this committee are: Jim Atkinson, Merri Crawford, Mike Paugh, Daniel Mondragon, Jean Thayer, Linda Palmer, and Michelle Bredine. Michelle Bredine will serve as the chairperson of this committee. They will begin their work soon. They will meet with Rev. Margaret and then with Canon Vanessa . We look forward to hearing from them about the progress of the rector search.
