Ash Wednesday, February 17, 2021

Greetings, Christ the King! Next Wednesday, February 17 we will begin the season of Lent by observing Ash Wednesday. As you know, ashes are typically a part of this service. The ashes are produced from the palms that we

have used during the Palm Sunday service (the prior year). Often, the ashes are smudged on the forehead of the penitent as a reminder to "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return."

Given our current situation, we will be **unable** to maintain a social distance of six feet to administer ashes and we will not be meeting in person. Therefore, we will <u>not</u> be administering ashes in the normal fashion.

The Ash Wednesday services will be conducted via Zoom at 12noon and 7pm. You are welcome to come to either one or both.

While we will **not** be administering ashes at church, we invite you to consider the following options and we ask that you only share the ash with people in your household following the COVID protocols that we all now know.

To recap:

Option 1: Attend service via zoom and stay at home. No ashes required.

Option 2: Come to church on Tuesday, Feb.16 to pick up a small container of ashes for your household only and take them home in time for the Zoom services on February 17. You will receive instructions on how to administer them yourself with the container and during the zoom service. *Please contact the church office for this option*.

Option 3: Go in your backyard and dig up a small amount of dirt to bring with you to the zoom Ash Wednesday service on February 17. You will receive instructions about how to administer the dirt, if you so choose, during the service.

Please know, any of these options are acceptable. Since some people prefer to have a tangible sign and symbol of this season, they are eager to participate in this way. If you would prefer to not to do that it is fine too.

Also during this season of Lent you are invited to participate in either of the following, we will be reading the Gospel of John in our Tuesday Bible study (all are welcome!) and the Diocese is offering a program of reflection called, "Path to the Passion" (see the article on page 5 of this newsletter).

Clergy Letter

Dear Christ the King,

Thanks to all of you who contributed to the Annual Report for 2020 and who helped with the Annual Meeting. Your ministries are making a difference in our community and we are grateful!

At our annual meeting on January 31 we elected two new vestry members, Nancy St. Pierre and Rick Atkinson. Your new wardens are Barb Jennings as Senior Warden and Bob Mickelson as Junior Warden. Your new vestry will gather on February 27 for our retreat; usually the vestry would take an overnight or day trip to a nearby facility but this time it will be over zoom given our current restrictions. We hope to still enjoy time getting to know each other better and planning for the year ahead of us.

As I shared during the Annual Meeting, your vestry will begin to take the next step in the search process for a new rector. Our first task will be to appoint a Search Committee to assist in the process.

If you are interested in serving in this capacity please contact one of your wardens or a vestry member. Please note that the search committee will be a very committed group meeting several times a month to pray, plan and prepare to receive names for future candidates. Their work will focus on listening to you all as the congregation and on collecting "data" about who we are as Christ the King and what information would be helpful to share with potential candidates via our online portfolio and profile.

As a member of the parish there are many other ways to contribute to this process. The main way you can contribute is to show up to parish meetings, to participate in surveys sent out via mail or email and to contact your vestry members or (future) search committee members if you have concerns or questions.

Your vestry and the Search committee (that will be appointed) will remain in contact with the Diocese and we will be providing you updates on the process in the months to come, via this newsletter, the Weekly Update, emails and our website (ctkarvada.org). In the meantime, I would invite you to pray for your church leadership vestry, search committee, Interim Rector and your Rector-to-be. Your prayers will prepare all of us to receive the gifts that God has in store for us.

Faith Formation


Bible Study Group Tuesdays, 2:00pm on Zoom


Men's Bible Study Wednesdays, February 3 & 17, 8:00am on Zoom

Yes, You Can Buy Gift Cards!

- 1. Open your own account by enrolling online; the process is simple. You can order cards and pay for them either with a charge card or a direct withdrawal from your bank. - 2. Cards can be ordered the "usual" way, an order form will be made available on ctkarvada.org, print out a copy, fill it out and mail it with your check to the church.

- *Shop with Scrip* offers gift cards from hundreds of familiar retailers, in amounts that vary from \$10 to \$500. Rebates to the church range from 1.5% to 18%, depending on the retailer.

The money from these gift cards programs is directed to our operating budget and it is a really easy way to help support our church.
