Our next book will be *Such a Fun Age*, by Kiley Reid. We will begin discussing the book on January 14.




Caring Connections

Yes, You Can Buy Gift Cards!

Even though we are not gathering, you can still order gift cards from Scrip and help the church. There are several ways to do this:

- 1. Open your own account by enrolling online; the process is simple. You can order cards and pay for them either with a charge card or a direct withdrawal from your bank. E-cards go directly to your email; physical cards can be picked up at the church. Here's the link; use enrollment code 23D7D74L55288 to create an account and get started.
- 2. Cards can be ordered the "usual" way, an order form will be made available on ctkarvada.org, print out a copy, fill it out and mail it with your check to the church.
