Get The Most Out of Your Irrigation System



- Set sprinklers to water the lawn or garden only not the street or sidewalk, because they don't grow!
- Play "zone" defense. Schedule each individual zone in your irrigation system to account for the type of sprinkler, sun or shade exposure, and the soil type for the specific area. The same watering schedule rarely applies to all zones in the system.
- Consult a professional. A certified irrigation professional can design, install, maintain, and/or audit your system to ensure optimal efficiency and that you are using the proper amount of water to maintain a healthy landscape.

Vestry Corner

Vestry Update

The Vestry received another report from the Search Committee and their progress. The Survey of the Congregation has been completed. The Search Committee has been compiling the responses and working on producing the Profile of our Church community to publish for applications from prospective rectors.

The Property committee continues to work on the problem areas of the physical church. Murphy Mechanical has been asked to assess the air flow in the Nave and other areas of the church building. The initial adjustments for the air conditioning in the Nave was accomplished and the complete assessment of the building will be done in July.

The Regathering Phase I was implemented with 25 parishioners meeting in the Chapel. The service has been livestreamed through YouTube and distribution of Communion was available after service. On June 27th we entered Phase II on the regathering with 52 parishioners gathering in the Nave. We were also able to hold the Funeral for Kit Ryan, beloved member of the Vestry, in the Nave with a reception in the parking lot.

We have had some volunteers for the Stewardship committee and the announcement of the committee will be made in the near future.

We look forward to a Town Hall type meeting with the Congregation perhaps in July or August with more updates on the progress of building projects and the progress of the Rector Search.

Babe Walls 2021 Mural Festival

For the second year, the Babe Walls mural festival returns to the greater Denver area as a celebration of womxn and nonbinary people in art. This year, the festival is in partnership with the City of Arvada and will run for four days beginning July 15-18. The location of the festival will be held along the east side of Arvada's Ralston Creek Trail, the City's longest and most complete trail.

The mission for Babe Walls is to celebrate womxn and nonbinary artists and to amplify the creative voices and expression of the feminine ingenuity. The term "womxn" is an alternative spelling to woman/women, as a way to reclaim the identity of womanhood as inclusive and intersectional and not defined in relation to men. This year's festival will include 26 artists, each working collaboratively to achieve 13 installations. For more information on the festival, visit babewalls.com

Both women and men will find this book invaluable in discerning how God might be calling them to use their own leadership skills.


