### **Clergy Letter**

Happy Summer, Christ the King family! I cannot begin to tell you all how excited my family and I are to be here with you. With my first Sunday coming up in just a few days, this Green Growing Season after Pentecost will be coming alive for us as we join the series of stories, parables, miracles, and encounters with Jesus that escort us through these summer and fall months. Outside of the sacred stories in scripture, our own sacred stories continue to unfold as our real lived lives continue to proclaim God's love and care in the world around us.

The journey from Santa Cruz brought our family of six people and four pets across three mountain ranges and four states. It also brought us out of a place of population density and stress into a place of peace, space, and the familiar comfort of the Rockies on our west horizon. As we drove out of CA, it literally took me a half hour of driving into the Sierras before I finally relaxed enough to realize I was surrounded by trees.

The natural world surrounding us is a place of sacred encounter. Other than the synagogues and temple, it was where Jesus most often went to pray, to teach, to heal, to feed, and to seek retreat. It was also the place of revelation in rivers and mountaintops. The journeys that Jesus took with his disciples and other followers, much like the journeys of the early Israelites, were the places of transformation, new beginnings, change, and revelation. The same remains true for us today as we step outside of the norms of our lives and find ourselves on the journeys that transform us in our lives and faith.

For many, the Covid pandemic has been a time of grieving what we've lost from the familiar norms of our lives, but it has also been an unexpected journey that has transformed us. It has made us more nimble and flexible as we've navigated the near constant changes of this wilderness journey that has brought us to where we are today. We don't yet know how this journey will end, but we do know that God travels this wilderness road with us. Having made the journey from Santa Cruz back

The year was 1900 and the resulting fear and furor unleashed untold medical challenges as well as 3 years of discriminatory treatment against the Chinese community, as two doctors of vastly different temperament and training raced to contain the disease before it could engulf the country. This amazing story is presented on PBS American Experience and is based on David K. Randall's book *Plague at the Golden Gate*.

#### **Vestry Update**

Vestry Corner for July 2022

With the shortfalls continuing in our financials, the Vestry has decided to have the Open Plate Offerings for July be directed to the General Fund. We will ask people to bring canned goods and non-perishables to support the Arvada Community Table. There will be boxes in the narthex for this purpose. With the carpet project completed, we will also put the light projects on hold right now. We'll be reconsidering building usage with outside groups now that Rev Austin is here to engage in the discussion. We will explore other Fund-Raising possibilities.

With the rate of COVID infection above 11%, the Vestry would like to continue to Recommend but not Mandate masking in the building. We will remove the capacity limit, but still encourage social distancing.
