Clergy Letter

Signs of Life: Why Church Matters

Dear People of God,

At our Annual Meeting, several people identified a desire to actively invite new people into the life of our congregation—behavior that is commonly known in church circles as "evangelism." Episcopalians are not well known for their efforts to convince others to join their congregations; as a seminary student, I heard more than once that "The people who belong here are already here." And at Christ the King, we're pretty good once someone has walked in the door; it's just getting them to the door that's tough.

One of the reasons that we have a hard time being more actively evangelical (and here, I think it is most mainline traditions) is simply this: we don't always pay attention to the signs of life that point to God in our daily life, signs that the church helps us to remember.

In her introduction to these reflections, Dr. Elisabeth Kimball points out that "There has been much research in the last decade on what sociologists and psychologists call the Loneliness Epidemic. This epidemic is something we all see across the generations of our friends, colleagues, and even within ourselves." And it turns out that we cannot satisfy our own desires for "a life with more beauty, purpose, and love than we can make for ourselves."

So the first step we must take, if we are to be able to engage others in our faith life, is simply that of remembering these basic gifts from God—light, water, food, shelter, and community—to see them, give thanks for them, and learn to share them with others. During the next five weeks, you'll have the chance to hear from several of monks from the order of St. John the Evangelist through video presentations during coffee hour, follow the calendar of daily practices, or use the booklet for weekly reflection.

May this season be a time of grace and blessing to you.

Returning and Rest Lenten Retreat, March 6-8, 2020





They include specially designed and engaging meditation areas, which bring scripture to life, and ethereal music with a Celtic sound.
