### Dear Christ the King,

Lent is upon us! Yesterday we celebrated Ash Wednesday and we have now entered the season of forty days that prepares us for Easter. As you know, Lent is about prayer, fasting and giving just as we heard yesterday in Matthew 6 where Jesus lays out details about how to give, pray and fast. Some of you choose to "give something up for Lent." This tradition comes



from fasting. So to give something up is to fast in order that we may draw closer to God and to learn more about what it means to be a disciple of Christ.

One of the prayers we pray on Ash Wednesday in our Litany of Penitence (see the Book of Common Prayer page 267) speaks of how we treat God's creation and how we care for ourselves and others on this planet. It reads:

For our waste and pollution of your creation, and our lack of concern for those who come after us,

Accept our repentance, Lord.

These words acknowledge that our pollution and waste does not simply go away even though it's carried to the landfill. Rather, it lingers and becomes the problem that future generations must grapple with in their time.

That's related to a recommendation I have for you this Lent. You may have heard that the Climate Care team at Christ the King is inviting us to give up single-use plastic this Lent, most notably plastic water bottles. The Climate Care team has personally invested and gifted blue metal water bottles (with the CTK logo on them) to each of you for this Lenten season. This is a way to encourage you to fast from single-use plastic and try out a reusable water bottle. It's a convenient size to pack in your purse or briefcase and you will be able to use it beyond the forty days of Lent.

So this Lent I invite you to consider the ways you will fast and pray. Please try out the blue metal water bottle that you will receive on Sunday and try it for a few days and begin the fast. It's an easy way to practice fasting from plastic and reminding us of our need to care for God's creation. Blessings to you this Lent and may you grow in God's grace.

#### Closing prayer:

Almighty God, in giving us dominion over things on earth, you made us fellow workers in your creation: Give us wisdom and reverence so to use the resources of nature, that no one may suffer from our abuse of them, and that generations yet to come may continue to praise you for your bounty; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.



Life Transformed: The Way of Love in Lent. This set of seven Adult Forums ties the Easter Vigil readings to the seven practices of the Way of Love. Drawing on the ancient practice of setting aside Lent as a period

of study and preparation for living as a Christian disciple (known as the catechumenate), the forums encourage participants to reflect on salvation history; walk toward the empty tomb; and embrace the transforming reality of love, life, and liberation. As we stand with the three women at the empty tomb, we hear his call to go and live that transformed reality.

### Just Say No To Plastic. Will You Join Us?

Looking for an environmental Lenten discipline this year? Why not give up using plastic water bottles for Lent? What better way to positively affect our planet! And, just in time to help with this Lenten idea, is a gift from our Climate Care Team at Christ the King. We would like to encourage everyone to use this beautiful, royal blue, aluminum, 17 ounce water bottle that has our Christ the King logo printed on it. Please look for your gift

after services on March 6th, the first Sunday in Lent.



- Avoid plastic bags. Use cloth and cotton bags. Alternatively, you can use biodegradable bags.
- Avoid travel size packaging, and try not to use those that hotels provide you. Take with you large sizes, which last longer.
- ♦ Avoid using plastic plates and cutlery.
- If using straws for drinking is a habit, avoid plastic straws and use those made of glass, paper, bamboo or steel.
- Avoid products enclosed in plastic packaging or drinks in plastic bottles. Choose those in glass or cardboard, easier to dispose of.

### Food For Thought



Did you know that it takes about a quarter of a water bottle's volume in petroleum to make the plastic bottle? That means that each 16-ounce bottle uses about 4 ounces of petroleum to produce it. That is about 17 million barrels of oil worldwide.

Also, only around 23% of these bottles get recycled. The rest end up in landfills or our oceans.

The average American buys an average of **167** disposable plastic water bottles, costing you **\$266**, a year. Want to cut the costs? With our average life span soaring to 80 years old, you could theoretically save **\$17,290** in your lifetime with a reusable water bottle.



Using Vanco Mobile App or Vanco online couldn't be easier - especially when travel, illness, or pandemic restrictions keep us away from in person attendance at church. An important tip to remember when covering the fee along with your gift is that Vanco calculates the fee and applies it to your gift or pledge automatically. There is no need for you to calculate the fee and add it to your total. As a reminder, the fee for checking account gifts is 1% while the fee for credit card gifts is 2.85%.
