## Take It from the Top ... Roofing Project Begins

During the major hail storm last May, our roof suffered some significant damage. Although we have had only a couple of small leaks, we do need to replace all of our roofing to secure the building for the winter. Fortunately, our insurance company agrees, and the Vestry was able to find a reputable, local contractor who can start work in the next few weeks. This project will include replacing the skylight in the narthex (which was damaged), the flat roof, and both of the shingled roofs.

Along with this work, another small group is looking into the possibility of installing solar panels to defray some of the costs of heating and air conditioning our building. Several other Episcopal churches have already installed solar panels, and one has put together a manual to help move us through this process. If you are interested in working with them, please contact Bob DeLong.

Thanks to Dave Burry, Bob Mickelson, Bob DeLong, and the rest of the Vestry for the work they have done to help us care for the gift of this building and property.

## A New Look for Faith Formation “A Word to Grow On”

Finding both the time and the teachers for a traditional church school program has been an increasing challenge. For the next several months (through December), we will be trying something new. All of our young people will start their formation in worship, with the rest of the congregation. Then, before we start the readings, the preacher will invite the younger members of our congregation (those between 4 and 8) up front for a brief introduction to the scripture lessons for today. Finally, the designated teacher will take the children to a classroom for discussion and a game or short project; everyone will return to the church for the Eucharist.

This isn't all we'll be doing for our young people, though. We are also changing our schedule for youth formation. Girls, ages 8 and up, will meet once a month after church, as will the boys, ages 8 and up. Then, once every other month, all of our youth will meet together on a Friday evening with Rev. Becky. And on alternate months, their families will have a social gathering together.

The schedule for each month will be printed in the Canticle and posted near the classrooms. Hopefully, this rhythm will better match both the desire for faith formation and the very busy schedules that all of our families have.

**Planina – Songs of Eastern Europe to Sing at Christ the King**  
**Sunday, October 22, 9:45 a.m.**

Planina - Songs of Eastern Europe is honored to provide music for the service on Sunday, October 22. We have been rehearsing at Christ The King for many years and deeply appreciate the Church's gracious welcome and support. From time to time we offer a concert or participate in a service to thank you, and this is one of those times! In addition to singing during the service, we will be providing some contemplative music beforehand.

We are a group of singers from the Denver-Boulder area performing the haunting and beautiful songs of eastern Europe, including music from Albania, Bosnia, Bulgaria, Croatia, Greece, Georgia, Hungary, Macedonia, Romania, Russia, Serbia, Turkey and Ukraine, and the Sephardic and Rom (Gypsy) traditions from some of those areas. Planina has been delighting audiences along the Front Range and elsewhere in Colorado since 1988. Though mostly not eastern European by heritage, the members share a fascination with the penetrating harmonies, asymmetric rhythms and challenging vocal techniques of this region, and they love to share their delight in this music with their audiences.

This music is steeped in the daily rhythms of centuries of agrarian life: a life that is gone or on the verge of extinction in many parts of eastern Europe. The songs reflect a wide range of moods, from the grief of people chafing under poverty and oppression to songs of romance, playfulness or pure joy.

## Clergy Letter

**Vision Statement**  
**Church of Christ the King**  
**November, 2013**

*We believe that God is calling Christ the King to create a spiritual home where ...

We build connections among our members and our neighbors, and  
We join with our neighbors in caring for our community and God's world.*

Dear People of God,

When we adopted this statement nearly four years ago, I don't know that any of us had a clue as to how we would live into this vision for our parish. We had some idea about how to center ourselves and how to build connections among our members, but how to build connections about our neighbors and to join with our neighbors in caring for our wider community and God's world—well honestly, that was a big question mark. It was clear that the Spirit was going to have to be guiding us if we were going to make any progress at all.

And indeed, the Spirit has been doing so. Over the past couple of months, a small group of us have been in conversation about how Christ the King might be more engaged with our neighborhood, especially the part of Arvada that surrounds Arvada High School. As many of you know, this area is changing significantly in its demographics and—to some extent—people have lost the sense of “neighborliness” that has been part of Arvada's appeal.

In the course of these conversations, we discovered that two organizations with national connections have begun focusing on Arvada and Jefferson County to help bring people together to make changes to improve the lives of people living here, through a process known as “community organizing.” Together Colorado (affiliated with PICO) and the Industrial Areas Foundation (IAF) have been meeting with faith and civic leaders to help them form and foster relationships with one another. Through intensive conversations, certain issues of deep concern emerge, issues that—to be effectively addressed—require a broad coalition of support. And at times, the actions taken by such groups may need to include public confrontation.

Several members of the parish attended meetings held by both of these groups, and then met to decide if there was a group that we wished to affiliate with, to make a commitment of time, energy, and money to this work. As we gathered last week and spoke together, we realized that neither group was right for us; in fact, the whole process of community organizing was not the appropriate strategy for Christ the King to become more engaged.

There is, however, another ways to being intentional about forming and fostering relationships with our neighborhood—however we choose to define it. One of these is called *Asset Building Community Development (ABCD)* and it has been used by other Episcopal organizations to help them find ways to work with the people and institutions in the neighborhood to improve their community. Copies of a brief introduction to the process will be on the table in the narthex, and a

group of us will be meeting on Tuesday, October 24, at 6:30 p.m. to discuss whether or not this approach will help us to live into the vision we articulated four years ago.

It is rarely clear where or when or how the Spirit will show up, but I have the strong sense that the Spirit is at work in our efforts to form and foster relationships with our neighbors. And for this—and the many other gifts that we have received—I continue to give thanks.

We will try to start this in late September or October 1.

We decided to have just a 9:00 service on December 24, to give everyone more time to set up for the later services. We also discussed changing the times for the second Christmas Eve service to 10:00 p.m. (Carols would then begin at 9:30 p.m.) We also confirmed having a Lessons and Carols service on December 31, using the "Christmas" series of readings.

To mark the season of Advent, Becky suggested having large Advent candles placed on the floor of the church, two in front and two toward the back. She will bring a prototype to the next meeting.

We will meet again on Wednesday, November 8, 7:00 p.m.; all are welcome to be a part of our planning.

Dear Partners in Mission,

Summer is always an intense time for me. The heat is tremendous and with air conditioning, a very limited commodity, it takes its toll. I remember flexibility being one of the characteristics that Peace Corps was interested in for potential volunteers. It seems to be the same for missionaries. This summer term I started with 2 classes and ended with 4. While I enjoyed the students and the classes, both additions were new to me so



required more preparation and an extra day and a half in the capital every week. The pictures show students learning about plyometrics and my group from the last clinical rotation. The director of the program recently left on maternity leave, though she will be checking in here and there. Please pray for her and her first child, as well as all the professors as we head into a new term the beginning of September without our director helping to put out fires that inevitably crop up.

A few years ago, God granted me the opportunity to stay in housing at the seminary during my nights in the capital, and I therefore had the pleasure of sharing a bit in the community life with the seminarians. ### Vestry Highlights September, 2017

#### Reports received:

- We heard presentations on the roof repair from two contractors: Academy Roofing and HomeGuard Restoration. Bob DeLong reported that we balanced income and expenses in August, though the expense figures do not fully capture the amount paid on our mortgage principal. Taking this into account, our cash decreased about \$2,000 in August.
- Bob Michelson reported that we will need to prime and paint exterior of the windows on Kempsell Hall and the offices before winter; he is working with Chris Romero to fix the entrance lights and continuing to clear brush along the north driveway.
- Dave Burry has repaired the outside door to the chapel and worked to secure the windows.
- Rev. Becky reported that Nash Cross has submitted his resignation from the Vestry.

#### Actions taken:

- With regret, the Vestry accepted Nash Cross's resignation.
- Dave Burry, Bob Mickelson, and Rev. Becky will review roofing bids and recommend a contractor to the Vestry for an email vote.
- We began reviewing the responses to the interviews the Vestry conducted this summer. We will continue this review next month.

We are excited to announce that our Family Winter Shelter will be open every night December 1 through March 31. In order for this to be successful we need volunteers! Here's a list of ways you can help:

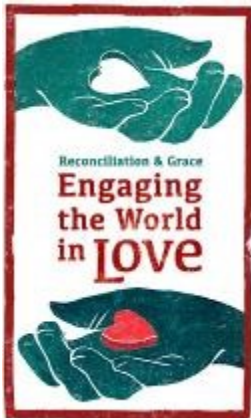
- Evening shift workers 5:30pm-9pm

The Family Winter Shelter started as a severe weather shelter only, and will continue to be so in October, November, and April. However, after implementing a beta program last March, we discovered how much more impactful we can be by staying open every night. Most of the families in the shelter are two parent, working families or actively looking for work. When families don't have a reliable place to stay every night, the kids and parents go to school and work disheveled, or don't go at all for fear of being found out as homeless. With the families staying every night, we can build relationships and help them solve problems and shorten their time on the streets. In light of this, **the shelter will be open every night December 1st through March 31st**. The goal of the shelter is to provide warm housing in the cold months, to invest in the lives of the families, shorten amount of time homeless, and create an environment to eliminate shame

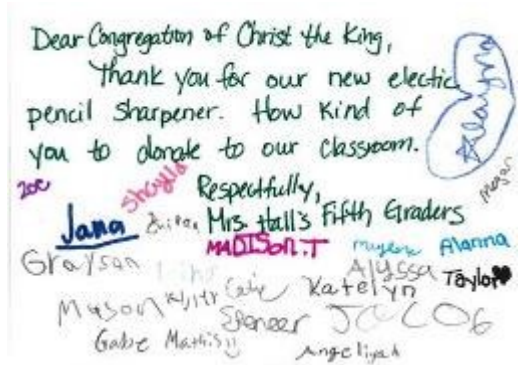
