



Preparing for Lent

Over the next few weeks, we'll be preparing for Lent, which begins on Wednesday, February 14. Part of this work involves planning, such as setting dates for the home Eucharists (see below), but there are some "actions" as well.



✘ We'll be preparing an "Alleluia" banner, which we will take out of the church on **Sunday, February 11**, to symbolically "bury" this word of praise, which we do not use in worship during Lent.

✘ We will also burn the palms from last Palm Sunday on this Sunday, to prepare the ashes for Ash Wednesday.

✘ We'll gather for the last "feast" on **Shrove Tuesday, February 13, 6:00 p.m., at our pancake supper**, traditionally intended to use up the sugar, fat, and meat that would not be eaten during Lent. The Men's Breakfast and Bible Study group will prepare and serve; proceeds will go to support our Bible Friends Camp. Tickets are \$5/person or \$15/family, and will be on sale in the narthex on Sundays and at the door. A brief service for the Imposition of Ashes will be offered at 7:15 pm.



Ash Wednesday Services February 14, 2018

The Imposition of Ashes and Holy Eucharist will be offered at 6:30am, 12:00 noon, and 7:00pm. We invite you to begin your Lenten observance with this solemn acknowledgement of our own mortality and our need for repentance.

Midweek Home Eucharists during Lent

Home Eucharists are planned for Tuesday, February 27, and Wednesday, March 14. If you would like to attend, please sign up on the table in the narthex or contact the church office (303-424-5288; office@ctkarvada.org). Rev. Becky will come and celebrate communion, followed by a shared (potluck) meal.

Journey into Faith, March 2 – 4



**Dead Sea Scrolls Exhibit:****A Lenten Pilgrimage****Saturday, March 17, 8:30 a.m.****Denver Museum of Science and Nature****(Start time at the museum: 9:15 a.m.)**

Dead Sea Scrolls exhibit offer a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to see one of the most significant archaeological discoveries of the 20th century. In 1947, a Bedouin goat herder stumbled upon a hidden cave along the shore of the Dead Sea, near the site of the ancient settlement of Qumran. Concealed within the cave were scrolls that had not been seen for 2,000 years. After extensive excavation, thousands of fragments from more than 900 remarkably preserved scrolls were recovered.



Christ the King has reserved 30 tickets for this event (\$25 for adults, \$20 for seniors over 65, \$18 for youth 3-18), and we will arrange rides from the church, leaving at 8:30 a.m. Please sign up for your ticket on the table in the narthex, or by contacting the church office (303-424-5288; office@ctkarvada.org). Annual Meeting Highlights

On Sunday, January 28, over 60 people gathered for the 56th Annual Meeting of the Church of Christ the King. The meeting opened with prayer and a song written by Andi Smith, "God, Grant Me Peace." Following approval of last year's minutes and the clergy report, participants broke up into ministry groups for discussion (outreach, stewardship, hospitality and communications, worship and music, faith formation for adults, youth and family ministry, Circle of Care, Crafters of the King. Four questions were posed:

How has this ministry been a blessing to you?

What have you longed to do as a part of this ministry?

What are your concerns about this ministry?

Is there anything else you'd like to say?

The results of these conversations are being collated and will be displayed in the narthex for the first three weeks of February.

Rev. Becky then recognized this year's recipient of the George E. Scholz Award, David Burry. Dave has made countless contributions to the parish over the past 30 years, including service on the Vestry and a search committee, assisting with major building projects, and fixing dozens of small mechanical parts, and the parish has benefited greatly from his generous presence.

After Rev. Becky thanked Sean McGaughey and Mark Molello for their three years of service on the Vestry, Sr. Warden Byron Giezentanner presented the nominations for the new Vestry. Byron and Bob Mickelson were elected to continue serving as Sr. and Jr. Wardens, and the following were elected as members of the Vestry:

We thank all those elected for their willingness to serve our parish in this way.

Clergy Reflections

**Renewing Relationships -
with God and One Another**

Dear People of God,

The season of Lent is almost upon us once again. If it feels early to you, it is. Unlike Christmas, which has a fixed date, the calendar for Lent and Easter are based on lunisolar calendar, similar to the Jewish calendar. Easter can come anytime between March 22 and April 25; this year it falls on April 1. Counting back 40 days (not including Sundays), we land on Wednesday, February 14, as the beginning of Lent.

This year, our theme for Lent will be “Renewing Relationships - with God and One Another.” It is easy to let these relationships become routine or slip away, for all of us know that maintaining a relationship—or helping it to grow—takes time and energy and attention. Our Lenten season, in particular, provides us with an opportunity to focus on this important work.

We will, of course, be offering some opportunities to do this here at Christ the King. In particular, I'd like to recommend that you think about joining with fellow parishioners for a home Eucharist or coming to the Dead Sea Scrolls exhibit at the Denver Museum of Nature and Science on Saturday, March 17. At the home Eucharists, we will share reflections on the scripture for the day, then celebrate communion and share dinner together. Prior to the Dead Sea Scrolls exhibit, on Sunday, March 11, I will offer a brief introduction to these ancient documents, and following the exhibit, on Sunday, March 18, those attending will be invited to share their experience. For your personal devotion, I invite you to take a copy of the Forward Day by Day, and a list of online meditation resources will be on the table in the narthex.

Lent comes only once a year, and I encourage you to take advantage of this time. And may you find ways to renew the relationships that sustain you.

- ✘ It wasn't clear that people understood the "tall" Advent candles, set around the edges of the pews, to be the Advent wreath, though having the Paschal candle in the center aisle at Christmas made this clearer.
- ✘ The Christmas music was fabulous (thanks to our Worshipping Voices and Chi Rho Handbell choirs), and using the carol, "The Friendly Beasts" to tell the Christmas story with the children was very effective.

As we look forward to Lent and Easter, we discussed the possibility of having only two services on Ash Wednesday, at 12:00 noon and 7:00 pm. For this year, we'll keep the 6:30 am service, and review it after Easter. The rest of our Lent and Holy Week schedule will remain the same.

A Music Note

If you've ever thought about joining the vocal choir, now is a good time. Why now? I know that Lent is still a couple of weeks away but we spend many weeks rehearsing anthems that we'll share during Holy Week and Easter. Caring Connections

Open Plate Offering for February Colorado Haiti Project



Since 1989, the Colorado Haiti Project has joined with local partners to significantly improve conditions in Haiti, focusing especially on education. St. Paul's School, operated through the Episcopal Church in Petit Trou de Nippes, has educated over 5,000 children. 300 students currently attend classes from preschool to 9th grade. For several years, 100% of 6th and 9th graders have passed the national exam.

Eight years after a major hurricane, Haitians continue to struggle with extreme poverty, widespread homelessness, unemployment, and a lack of clean water and energy. The Colorado Haiti Project also assists the wider community through student gardens, an agricultural program, girls' and women's empowerment program, a seed bank, a tree-planting program, installation of 12 water wells, and in 2017—18 funded the work of 45 health workers going to hard-to-access communities. At present, it supports the livelihood of over 100 staff in Haiti.

Missionary Report from the Dominican Republic

January 16, 2018

Dear Partners in Mission,

The start of term is always a chaotic time at the university and I usually do my best to stay away from the office so as not to add to the confusion. This time, however, I needed to touch base about something with the secretary and entered the fray. Amongst those at the back of the office talking with the director was a former student of mine. She took a moment to come up and greet me, informing me of her new role as a professor. She asked if she could meet with me to talk about

ideas. We met for lunch the following week and we shared ideas of teaching, with pros and cons of different styles. By the end of lunch, we knew one another better and she had gleaned some ideas to adjust her plan a bit and I gained a better understanding of a technique commonly used here that I've not employed. It is such a blessing to be here over time, which allows me to see and contribute to the growth in individuals as well as the career. Thank you for joining me in this mission, to help form physical therapists on the island of Hispaniola and improve the level of care they are providing for people needing rehabilitation services here. Please pray for God to guide me in my teaching and community ministries.

Core Communities

Vestry Highlights January, 2018

Reports received:

- ◆ The Finance Committee reviewed the 2018 budget and then met with the Executive Committee.
- ◆ Bob DeLong reported that our net income for 2017 exceeded our expenses, thanks to very generous gifts during December. We still have some work to do on our 2018 budget which, at this point, shows a significant deficit.
- ◆ Dave Burry reported that the work on the roof is done, except for the installation of the skylight, which is scheduled for January 29. Bob Matter (A New Spin) is continuing to work with the City of Arvada to find a new home for the storage trailer at the northeast corner of the parking lot, following the complaints of a neighbor.
- ◆ Bob Mickelson reported that he continues to replace lights, but we will need to find/rent a scissors lift to replace the bulbs that shine on the altar.
- ◆ Rev. Becky reported that she is serving on the Profile Committee as part of the search process for a new bishop. We are making progress with the transition to Comcast, and she suggested that we plan some parish cleanup/clean out days to help us sort through some clogged closets. Deacon Joe continues to spend time at The Rising Day Center each week, and has collected blankets and sleeping bags. He and Deacon Linda Brown are conducting a training for Eucharistic Visitors on January 27.

Actions taken:

- ◆ Finalized the nominations for Vestry: Byron Giezentanner, Sr. Warden; Bob Mickelson, Jr. Warden; Barbara Jennings and Daniel Ohamaka, 3-year terms; Linda Palmer and Tabitha Tagne, 2-year terms.
- ◆ Adopted the proposed preliminary budget, with approximately a \$30,000 deficit, as presented. Final approval is pending, following a review in May, 2018.
- ◆ Allocated \$1,000 of the 2017 proceeds of the Christmas Tea to a contingency fund for Kempself Hall updates.
- ◆ Reviewed the agenda for the annual meeting.
- ◆ Set Vestry Retreat date for Saturday, February 10, 9:00am - 1:00pm.

New business:

Reflections from outgoing Vestry members, Sean McGaughey and Mark Molello, which included the recommendation that we look for professional assistance to help with fundraising and revenue development.


This year's retreat will be led by the Rev. Michelle Danson, Episcopal priest, spiritual director, retreat leader, and educator.
